
I had been so proud that the newsletter was, for the most part, wrapped up over a week ago. Did I fall asleep under a tree?

Pepper Corn Chowder

Serving size: cup Yield: 8 cups Start to Finish: 40 mins



Ingredients:

- 1 cup chopped onion
- 1 leek, cleaned and chopped
- 5 cups loose-pack frozen whole kernel corn
- 2 14 ounce can reduced-sodium chicken broth
- 1 medium red sweet pepper, chopped
- 1/8 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1/8 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 3 saffron (optional)
- Snipped fresh chives and/or ground black pepper (optional)

Directions:

- 1. Coat a 4-quart Dutch oven with nonstick cooking spray. Preheat over medium for 1 minute. Add onion and leek; cook 5 minutes until tender, stirring occasionally.
- 2. Add corn; cook 5 minutes or until corn softens, stirring occasionally. Add one can of the chicken broth. Bring to boiling; reduce heat. Cover and simmer 20 minutes or until corn is very tender. Remove from heat and cool slightly.
- Transfer half the corn mixture to a blender or food processor; cover and blend or process until smooth. Return pureed corn mixture to Dutch oven.
- 4. Add remaining broth, the sweet pepper, 1/8 tsp. black pepper, cayenne pepper, and saffron. Heat through. Top with snipped fresh chives and/or additional ground black pepper. Makes 6 (1-1/3-cup) servings.

We know that Ford is touting with the idea of a worldly Mustang car. We also have heard that the new 2014 Ford Mustang will be jointly designed by its world divisions, and this new Ford Mustang commercial just reassure that idea.

Although not much changes in the new 2013 Ford Mustang, we do see some noticeable changes such as the headlight and taillights. The commercial reveals various models of the Mustang to everyone's taste. The commercial is touting that the Mustang can be personalized through its online configurator, and we have seen about four million people who have submitted their builds online already. The commercial shows the Mustang GT, Boss 302 and Shelby GT500.

Ford hasn't revealed the technical specs on all new 2013 Mustang models, but we expect it to carry the same engines throughout with a boost in power. The Mustang GT will be carrying the same V8 engine producing 420 horsepower, and recently news states that the Shelby GT500 will have its power boosted to around 650-hp.

1971 Ford Mustang Coupe Sleeper

Questions Abound About This Plain-Vanilla Sleeper

The question is, "Why?" Why would someone order, in late 1970 or early 1971 from Monaco & Sons Motor Sales in Glastonbury, Connecticut, a white Mustang coupe with a Drag Pack 429 Cobra Jet, a Hurst-shifted four-speed, and a 4.11 Detroit Locker rearend? And why would they avoid all other options except power disc brakes, a console, and tinted glass? In 1971, most Mustang performance buyers wanted the glory to go with the guts, opting for the muscular Mach 1 or at least a SportsRoof with flashy Magnum wheels. But the original owner of this unusual coupe--with dog-dish hubcaps, no less--obviously wanted an ultimate 370hp sleeper. We may never know why.

Ford performance collector Jacky Jones, from Young Harris, Georgia, doesn't really care why the original owner wanted such a plain-Jane machine. When he found the rough, unrestored car at the Carlisle All-Ford Nationals a couple of years ago, he knew it would be a grand conversation piece for his collection of rare, unusual, and ultra-high-performance Fords. If you break down the production numbers in Kevin Marti's book, Mustang... By the Numbers, you'll find that Ford produced 86 Mustang hardtops with 429 CJ engines in 1971. Of those, just 23 were C-code (non-Ram-Air) versions, with only 11 having the four-speed. Marti is currently researching the Drag Pack option-- it's possible only three 1971 Mustang coupes were equipped like Jacky's.

You may have noticed the Ram-Air hood on the otherwise-plain exterior. Although this coupe didn't get the Ram-Air CJ-R, it's equipped with the non-functional NASA-scooped hood as part of the Drag Pack option, which converted the 429 CJ into a Super Cobra Jet with definitely functional items like a solid-lifter cam, cap-screw connecting rods, forged pistons, and oil cooler, plus either the 3.91 Traction-Lok or 4.11 Detroit-Locker differential.

After purchasing the Mustang at Carlisle, Jacky had it delivered to his personal shop, where Mike Plott began the tedious restoration, a chore that included locating hard-to-find NOS parts for '71 Mustangs. With help from fellow collectors/restorers Ed Meyers, Bob Perkins, and Steve Vanderwall, Mike rounded up NOS door panels, a headliner, a dashpad, F60x15 Goodyear Polyglas tires, and even an ultra-rare radio delete block-off plate. Like all of Mike's restorations for Jacky, the 1971 coupe was restored to factory condition, right down to the paint dabs, "Paint OK" markings, and engine compartment decals. Garland Smallwood "freshened" the 429 SCJ engine before it was lowered into the immaculately detailed engine compartment.

A white coupe with a black standard interior and dog-dish hubcaps, and not even a radio. It doesn't get much plainer. But for some reason, someone ordered this vanilla '71 with all the performance toppings. Makes you wonder...Why?

NASCAR: Ford's Jamie Allison says 2013 car design shows series is listening to fans

The 2013 Ford Fusion that will race in the NASCAR Sprint Cup Series is designed to look like the street model.

According to Jamie Allison, the plan in Dearborn, Mich., was to introduce Ford's iconic Mustang into NASCAR Sprint Cup Series racing by 2013. But last year, he and his staff at Ford Racing abandoned that idea and instead began designing an updated, sportier and more identifiable Fusion model.

On Tuesday afternoon, during the 30th-annual NASCAR Media Tour stop at Charlotte Motor Speedway, the year-away car was publicly unveiled and ran its first on-track shakedown laps with Roush Fenway driver Greg Biffle.

The car includes more Ford-specific brand identity than manufacturers have incorporated in recent years, a theme that will continue when Dodge, Chevrolet and Toyota reveal their 2013 cars in the coming months. "The brand of cars [in NASCAR racing] is second only to their favorite drivers among our fans," said series president Mike Helton. "We want to bring back the identity of the cars that are in our driveways."

Allison, director of Ford North American Motorsports, said his company "had lost our way, but we listened to our fans and NASCAR listened to fans who said they couldn't tell a Ford from a Dodge from a Chevrolet. This project started when we introduced Mustang into Nationwide [racing] in 2010. That was a tipping point; the reaction we got from Mustang was tremendous.

"We always said that was a great first step. We, along with NASCAR and the [other] manufacturers, wanted to go further in Sprint Cup. We planned to move Mustang into Cup until we saw the sleek lines of this car in the design studios. When we saw it, we knew it belonged on the track in Sprint Cup.

"We wanted Fusion to be the car that helped return 'stock car' to NASCAR. I think fans, when they see the car, are just going to smile and cheer. It is going to reengage them with the sport and make the sport better."

Ford spent a year designing the new Fusion before taking it to Charlotte Motor Speedway for its Tuesday unveiling. "This is good for our business," Allison said. "We've found that 84 percent of race fans watch NASCAR, so this is where this car should be."

Penske Racing is returning to Ford

In a somewhat surprising move, Penske has announced that it will leave Dodge and switch to Ford Racing beginning with the 2013 season. Penske's Brad Keselowski and AJ Allmendinger (assuming both remain with the team) will begin running the Ford Fusions in the Sprint Cup series, and Penske's Nationwide drivers will begin driving Ford Mustangs next year.

Certainly, Ford has plenty to be proud of these days, with Roush Fenway Racing winning the Daytona 500 (Matt Kenseth), earning the pole in the race (Carl Edwards), and winning one of the Duels (Kenseth again, with Greg Biffle in the mix). And Ford is coming off Edwards' near-victory year. This will only strengthen Ford's position in the coming years.

"As you know, Dodge has been aligned with Penske Racing for the past 10 years," Roger Penske said in a media conference. "Together, we've had much success on and off the track. Obviously, throughout the 2012 season we are committed to winning races, making the Chase and hopefully winning the championship."

Penske emphasized that the decision wasn't about money, but more about alignment with Ford and the resources of Roush Fenway. "We want to thank Dodge for what they've done for us," he said. "I think we've delivered and they've delivered, and we've got a big job to do ahead of time, but this was a business decision ... I think when we weighed the plusses and minuses of the opportunity, it was apparent to us that we need to win the NASCAR Sprint Cup championship and we have been trying to do it alone."

Certainly, this leaves Dodge's future up in the air as well, particularly as it works to roll out its new Challenger model. Many questions remain to be answered, but for now, score a win for Ford.

The 1971 - 1972 Shelby Europa GT350 and GT500

Claude Dubois has been the official Shelby dealer in Belgium from 1966 through to 1972. Initially his sales area was limited to Belgium, but later extended to Europe (1967-1969). Another important european Shelby dealer was Performance Cars. Ltd. from George Filippinetti in Geneve/Switzerland.

Claude Dubois sold about 120 - 125 Shelbys and Cobras to european 'snake maniacs'. When Claude received the bad news in 1970 that Shelby was not going to send any further G.T.350/500 to him, he proposed a special Shelby Europa licenced Mustang conversion to him.

Carroll agreed and the first one was completed in January 1971 and shown at the Brussels Motor Show. Actually all cars that went to Claude Dubois, were not send from Shelby American, but were ordered via Bob Ford, a dealership in Detroit, Michigan from Ford Motor Company. Not all were shipped via Bob Ford, some of the later cars went directly from the Ford factory to a shipping agency called Sopac Transport to Port Newark. research from Kevin Marti (www.martiautoworks.com). Special Shelby parts were actually delivered from Shelby American.

Carroll Shelby joined the Brussels presentation and he had a good hot Chili with Claude together in the evening. It has not been reported, wether they had a portion of Belgium's famous Pommes frites as well, but it is very likely that they were available that same evening.

The Shelby Europa was offered as a fastback (sportsroof) and convertible, both powered by a 351. Acc. to french and dutch sales literature they were offered in a G.T.500 version as well.

One at least had a 351 race engine with a 780cfm Holley carb and 360HP, another one a 429 with a Drag Pack option and closely 400HP. The cars were not allowed to be re-imported to the US due to the then stronger safety and exhaust emissions regulations. Due to the high fuel prices, the demand for a Shelby Europe was not really big, only scandinavians did not care as for most muscle cars in that period. Only 14 Shelby Europe were built and sold in 1971 and 1972. 9 are currently accounted for and on file of the SAAC.

There were 3 in the Netherlands, however the third dutch Shelby Europe of C.V. Bastiaanse has been stolen in 1987 and never appeared again. Watch out for a red one. One of the other one not yet found is the white 429 equipped Shelby Europa.

Only 2 of the 14 made are convertibles and both are currently owned by Rauno Harvima in Finland.

2011 Ford Mustang GT takes flight

Mustang sales skyrocket in February, surpass Camaro

The Ford Mustang started off 2012 in the right direction with sales up 18 percent in the month of January compared to the previous year (3,736 vs 3,165). That doesn't hold a candle compared to February sales, though, with customers purchasing 7,351 Mustangs – the largest sales month for the Mustang for the last ten months. That number also represents a 96.8% increase compared to January 2012 and a 98.8% increase compared to February Mustang sales (3,697) of 2011. Year-to-date, Mustangs sales have improved 61.6%, 11,087 in 2012 compared to 6,862 in 2011.

Perhaps for bragging rights more than anything else, the Ford Mustang also surpassed the Camaro in sales for the first time since June of 2011. The Camaro managed just 6,923 sales, 428 units behind the Mustang.

For the last two years the Mustang has also posted an increase of sales in March compared to February, so hopefully Ford can continue the positive momentum throughout the first half of the year.

Chicago cops order Ford's new police cars By Chris Woodyard, USA TODAY



Get used to searching your rear-view mirror for the telltale headlights of a 2013 Ford Taurus: The first Police Interceptor is being delivered today as more departments order them.

The latest police agency to choose the Taurus over the Chevrolet Caprice or Dodge Charger is the Chicago Police Department, which is taking a mix of the Taurus version and Ford Explorer SUV version. It ordered 500 total; the mix is yet to be disclosed.

No surprise that Chicago would pick Ford: The plant that makes the Taurus version of the Police Interceptor is in the Windy City. Another 1,200 smaller police agencies have placed orders for cars as well, and the first one went out the door today.

"We are pleased and proud Chicago has decided to purchase Ford's Police Interceptor vehicles," said Ken Czubay, a Ford vice president. "Ford has been the police pursuit vehicle market leader for 15 years, and we know these all-new vehicles can handle the rigors of police work."

The Police Interceptor sedan and utility vehicles started production at the company's Chicago Assembly Plant last month. It added 230 jobs at the Torrence Avenue plant.

Ford's new police car replaces the venerable Crown Victoria, which stopped production last year. The Crown Victoria was loved as a big, heavy, rear-wheel drive. Taurus has gas-saving turbocharging in the police version, but is front-wheel drive, which some departments may resist compared with the rear-drive Chevrolet Caprice, which is imported from Australia.




