recipe

Monterey Chicken Spaghetti

Prep Time: 10 min / Cook Time: 40 min

INGREDIENTS:

- · 12-oz dried spaghetti
- · 4 cups chopped cooked chicken
- 1 (16-oz) container sour cream
- 2 (10.75-oz) cans condensed cream of chicken soup
- · 1 (10-oz) package frozen spinach, thawed and drained
- · 2 cups shredded Monterey Jack cheese, divided
- · 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 1 (6-oz) can French's French Fried Onions, divided

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°F. Lightly spray a 9x13-inch pan with cooking spray.
- 2. Cook spaghetti according to package directions. Drain.
- 3. In a large bowl, combine cooked chicken, cream of chicken soup, sour cream, drained spinach, 1 cup cheese, garlic and 1/2 can of French's French Fried Onions.
- 4. Stir in cooked spaghetti. Pour into prepared pan. Sprinkle remaining shredded cheese and onions on top of pasta mixture.
- 5. Bake, uncovered, for 40 to 50 minutes.



One of the many goal's of the Mustang Owner's Museum is to find and present unique vehicle that are part of the Mustang heritage and share their story.

A perfect example of this is the Western Mustang. It is a 1976 Mustang II, built as part of very unique marketing plan.

The marketing plan actually consists of two parts. The first part is the Western Mustang II as shown above and the second part was the Western Truck made to match thethe Western Mustang interior and accent pieces.

Both vehicles were built at Ford's Performance Center and while the concept was well received in marketing tests, Ford decided against putting this program in place.

The concept was that the truck and Mustang II were sold together as a package, with the goal of selling 50 "sets".


The original Western Truck has long since been crushed, but one of the builders' saved the Western Mustang from a similar fate, keeping the one of a kind Mustang in perfect condition.

In fact, he is hoping to have a replica of the Western Truck done in time for the 55 Years of Mustang event.


The 1976 Western Mustang II will be on display in the Mustang Owner's Museum for the Grand Opening next April.











With more than 10 million Mustangs built, and some long-lost cars like the pair used in Bullitt having surfaced in the last few years, it's a surprise at just how many significant Mustangs are still out there and not well known. Like this one, the first pre-production Mustang hardtop. And it's coming to auction in January.


This 1965 model is said by the seller to be "the very first Ford Pilot Plant/Pre-production Mustang hardtop." That means it was hand assembled at the Ford Pilot Plant in Michigan. Originally the home to the Continental Mark II, it was later used to test out the assembly process for new products.

The listing says that this is one of just three known Pilot Plant cars to survive, and is the first hardtop built. It wears VIN 002. It's been fully restored, but the seller says that every major component is still the original matching numbers piece.

While it's usually the V8 Mustangs that get all the love, this one is powered by the 105 hp, 156 lb-ft 170 ci straight six. Paired with a three-speed manual gearbox.

It comes with two binders full of ownership and condition affidavits from the previous owners and photos, statements, and signatures from important Mustang names. More importantly, the binders contain the history of the car and restoration documents. Plus a letter from Ford confirming that this car is the first Mustang hardtop.

The beautiful car has seen TV and film appearances, including the upcoming Ford versus Ferrari movie set for next year. the car will be sold at the Barrett Jackson Scottsdale auction in January.







Ford's New Mustang Supercar Racer Looks Like A Beast On Track

What's better than a Ford Mustang? Not much, to the legions of the pony-car faithful around the world. But a racing Mustang might be up there. Like the one that Ford's preparing for Australia's Supercars championship.

With the Falcon now a thing of the past, Ford Performance is developing the Mustang as its replacement for the highly competitive touring-car series Down Under. And it's now taken it out on the track for the first time – still wrapped in camouflage – before it's ready to take on next year's calendar.

"What an honour to be the guy to drive the very first laps of the new Mustang," said DJR Team Penkse's current championship-leader Scott McLaughlin, who shared the wheel with his teammate Fabian Coulthard (cousin to former F1 driver David) during the test session. "Not only does it just look right, and sound awesome, but it feels right too – in terms of balance, settings – we're starting off a great base as we develop the car for next year."

Once testing is complete, the Mustang Supercar is set to make its race debut at the Adelaide 500 to be held at the end of February, when it will face off against similarly prepared racing versions of the Nissan Altima and the new Insignia-based Holden Commodore.

"The Mustang Supercar is absolutely amazing," said Ford Performance global motorsports director Mark Rushbrook. "It joins the Mustang GT4, which we had the honour of showing at Bathurst this year, as well as our new NASCAR and NHRA Mustang in 2019. There's a lot going on for Mustang, and to have the first Supercars test such a productive and rewarding step, fans have a lot to look forward to."



What is the Challenger Mustang Special?

The 1968 Challenger Special occupies a unique place in Mustang history and, although it was limited only to dealerships in Mississippi, it continues to be remembered fondly as an important early pony car variant that paved the way for models to come. The Challenger Special is especially notable for how it offered budget-conscious drivers a way to add more power and improved performance to the base model, foreshadowing the important role '70s and '80s tuner culture would play in revitalizing the brand.

ALL ABOUT THE CHALLENGER SPECIAL

The Mustang Challenger Special package was available only for the 1968 model year and only as a dealer-installed option on Seafoam Green hardtop coupes. The Mustang Challenger Special first took the 289 V8 as its base and then, from early May onward, the 302 V8. The goal of the Mustang Challenger Special was to provide an economical way for drivers to get more performance out of their Mustang — to that end, curb weight was kept low with the omission of power options and air conditioning.

The main additions to the Mustang Challenger Special edition were a set of Shelby intakes and a specially manufactured 4118 Holley carburetor. Combined with the absence of any options, these additions gave the Challenger Special a low power-to-weight ratio with performance approaching that of the more expensive Shelby variants.

AVAILABILITY

The Challenger Special was available only from dealers in the Mississippi area. All Challenger Specials originated from the New Orleans District Sales Office (DSO), where the model's special intakes and carburetors were installed. The optional package was available for an extra \$158 over list pricing. It is estimated that only a few units were sold in Mississippi — models equipped with the 302 engine have been isolated to VIN numbers 8F01J193649-70. Similar packages were sold at dealers across the country, although none were promoted as a special edition the way the Mississippi cars were.

It is unclear how many Challenger Special Mustangs are on the road today. Given the small numbers that were produced and the limited geographical area they were confined to, it is rare to see one come up for auction.

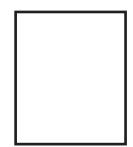
