Slow Cooker Steak Soup

Prep Time: 5 min / Cook Time: 8 hour

INGREDIENTS:

- 2-1/4 lb sirloin tip roast, cut into 1-inch cubes
- 1/4 cup flour
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1/2 tsp ground pepper
- 2 Tbsp canola oil
- 1 (1-oz) envelope dry onion soup mix
- 4 cups beef broth
- 1 Tbsp tomato paste
- 1 Tbsp Worcestershire sauce
- 2 cups uncooked medium egg noodles

DIRECTIONS:

1. Combine roast, flour, salt and pepper in a large ziplock bag. Seal and shake to coat beef.

2. Heat oil in a large skillet over medium-high heat. Remove beef from ziplock bag, discard any excess flour mixture. Sauté beef until browned, about 5 minutes.


3. Place meat into slow cooker. Add onion soup mix, beef broth, tomato paste and Worcestershire sauce. Cook on LOW for 8 hours, until beef is tender.

4. Add noodles to slow cooker. Cover and cook on LOW for 15-30 minutes, until noodles are tender.

Central Valley Mustang Club

At the board meeting on September 23, 2018 the proposed bylaw changes were presented, discussed and modified to submit to the members of the club for vote at the November 2018 General Membership meeting.

The first of the two bylaw changes cleans up the process of elections with clear language and direction for the nominating committee. It allows the members to seek out information with a clear process and efficient election process.

In the second of the bylaw proposals it cleans up the process to get things accomplished in a timely manner. At current it can take up to 90 days to change or modify a bylaw. Thus, making things difficult when an issue is time sensitive. The proposed bylaw allows the board that is elected by the membership to do the job they are elected for by having a clear process for maintaining, updating and changing the bylaws when needed. It is encouraged that members who wish to be part of the discussion of change to the bylaws attend the board meeting to participate in the process.

CURRENT BYLAW: Article VII - Elections

Section 1. A nominating committee shall be designated by the President at the October meeting of the Board of Directors and shall consist of not less than four members, one of whom shall be a member of the existing Board of Directors. The nominating committee shall prepare a slate of nominees for the officers, at-large members and the Chairperson of Standing Committees for presentation at the October membership meeting. Nominations may also be made from the floor prior to the elections which shall be held at the November membership meeting.

Section 2. A nominee for any office or position receiving a plurality of votes shall be considered elected.

PROPOSED BYLAW CHANGE:

Article VII - Elections

Section 1. A nominating committee shall be designated by the President at the September meeting of the Board of Directors and shall consist of not less than three members, one of whom shall be a member of the existing Board of Directors. The nomination committee shall prepare a slate of nominees for the officers, at-large members and the activity chairperson. The remaining committee chairperson can be appointed by the president with the approval of the newly elected board. The slate of nominations will be presented at the October general membership meeting. Nomination will be taken at the October General Meeting from the floor. Once the floor nominations and the slate of nominations from the committee are approved no additional nominations will be excepted unless a vacant position had no nomination.

Members will be advised in September at the General Meeting and via Newsletter to read the description of the positions available and be aware of the responsibilities. To review the bylaws the member must request a copy via E-mail to the President, Nomination Committee chair or Vice-President.

Section 2. A nominee for any office or position receiving a majority of votes shall be considered elected to the position which they were nominated.

CURRENT BYLAW: Article VIII – Amendments

Section 1. New bylaws may be adopted or these bylaws may be amended or repealed by a two-thirds vote of members present or represented by proxy at any regular or special meeting where written notice has been given to the membership as set forth in Article IV, Section 3.

PROPOSED BYLAW CHANGE

Article VIII – Amendments

Section 1. New bylaws may be adopted or these bylaws may be amended or repealed by a two-thirds vote by the Board of Directors. Members present during a proposed bylaw proposal may contribute to the discussion prior to the voting of the board.

Instagrammer Leaks 2020 Ford Mustang Shelby GT500

The Ford Mustang Shelby GT350 is a badass. It looks angry as hell, has a bespoke flat-plane-crank V8 that makes it sound even more furious, and takes the performance potential of the S550 Mustang to lofty heights. However, the Shelby GT350 is part of a pair. Whenever we hear the name GT350, it automatically makes us think of the GT500. There hasn't been a new GT500 since the Trinity-powered model ceased production at the end of the 2014 model year. Thanks to one gutsy Instagram user, Sinister Lifestyle, we now know what the 2020 Shelby GT500 will look like.

Judging by the geotag and the surroundings, it looks as if the 20-year-old also known as Kyle snapped a couple of sneak shots at an official Ford event. It's likely that Kyle took them at a preview of the upcoming Challenger Hellcat and Camaro ZL1 fighter for Ford dealers. (We are as grateful for his courage as we are worried about his future employment.)

Aside from the wheels and the rear wing, the two pictures show a car that closely resembles our rendering of how we thought the new 2020 Shelby GT500 would look. The gaping maw of a front grille is bisected by a thick bar. Above that is a Cobra badge; below is just mesh, ready to suck in air to cool the powerful engine. Jalopnik thinks that it could be a supercharged V8 capable of generating as much as 770 horsepower and 743 lb-ft of torque. Two more massive air intakes sit below the headlights.

The thin-spoked wheels are most certainly made out of carbon

fiber. We could believe it if the same were also true of the massive rear wing. Combined, they give the 2020 Shelby GT500 a handling-focused, track-ready appearance.

It's a shame that we'll have to wait until January's Detroit Auto Show to "officially" see the 2020 GT500, but these pics should hold us over until then. They're going to have to.



UPDATE (again): Ford teases V-8-powered Mustang hybrid, could be called Mach 1



Ford buried a teaser for what appears to be the Mustang hybrid inside a promotional video that the automaker released on Friday. The automaker wants you to know it intends to build the future, not just talk about it. And suddenly the Mustang's future looks more intriguing.

At the 0:37 mark of the video, the Mustang comes into full view, with a brightly lit version of the iconic badge in the middle of the grille. The shadowy teaser is reminiscent of the current sixth-generation Mustang's design, but the creases appear smoother, and there's a less jagged look to this car in general. Of note, the grille opening is filled with a plastic piece like you see on many electric cars.

Just before the front end is shown there's a shot of the engine bay, which very clearly has four pistons on each side of the engine—a V-8 engine. The entire engine bay is lit up like Tron in neon blue, Ford's signature color in its promotions for electrification recently.

There's also reason to believe the new Mustang hybrid will sport the Mach 1 name, as it was supposed to be resurrected for the upcoming performance-oriented Mustang-inspired all-electric SUV. That idea was killed after the public reacted poorly to the idea. In the video an original Mach 1 is seen at



the 0:34 mark, just before a current Mustang at the 0:35 mark, before the engine bay and front end is shown. This might be the clue that Ford now intends to use the Mach 1 name for the Mustang hybrid.

Motor Authority reached out to Ford for a comment on the unannounced Mustang. A spokesperson simply said, "It's a glimpse of the future. We are excited to show you more at the right time."

This could be a preview the seventh-generation Mustang, which is due in 2021. More likely, though, it's the hybrid that was previously announced and will reportedly be based on the current sixth-generation car and arrive in 2020.

The next-generation Mustang will reportedly roll on Ford's new modular platform shared with the next Ford Explorer and Lincoln Aviator. Thus, rumors have swirled about the possibility of an all-wheel-drive Mustang, which the new platform will support. Currently, the pony car rides on a dedicated architecture, making it the only modern muscle car to do so. The Chevy Camaro and Dodge Challenger both use modular platforms shared with other vehicles.

SPECIAL EDITION: Dusk Rose 1967 Mustang Colt Hardtop

Could this be a Dusk Rose 1967 Special Edition Colt Mustang? It seems to have the same Colt emblems as the 1966 and 1968 version - see the next photo. The car has a dealer emblem from Les McLane in York, Pennsylvania. A site visitor found this photo. We are attempting to contact the owner. Do you know anything about this car?

I've blown up the image of the C-pillar. You can see a triangular emblem that looks a lot like the Country Squire emblem to the right that was used on some the Colt Mustangs. It also has lettering under the emblem which is short - probably COLT.

This Mustang was sold from Les McLane in York Pennsylvania. Do you know what they were promoting? We know from advertising that the 1966 Colt Mustang was created by Bob Davidson Ford in Baltimore Maryland. Bob Davidson Ford was giving away Colt's Football tickets then later Colt 45 beer. The 1968 Colt Mustang came from Bill Marsh Ford of Newtown, Pennsylvania and was part of promotion to promote a His and Her's Mustang set - the Colt Mustang and the Lady Mustang.
